We Are

Blessed Ministry Community Church (BMCC), formerly named Blessed Minority Christian Fellowship, was founded in 1992 as originating from the Religion Group within Ten Percent Club, one of the oldest LGBTI+ organizations in Hong Kong. The group has grown in size and is now incorporated as a church organization (NGO). BMCC is now one of the oldest inclusive churches affirming LGBTI+ individuals in Asia. It is a non-denominational church that is open to people of all genders, sexualities, races, classes, and ages and does not set preconditions based on these traits for people to serve within the church or to participate in any church activities.

We proclaim love and justice, and we invite everyone to receive these as a calling for life.

We encourage believers to think critically and responsibly, to respect women and all who experience discrimination, to care for vulnerable communities, and to pursue personal spiritual formation living as engaged citizens connected to society.

Because our theological convictions differ from those of most mainstream churches, we have often been rejected and even labeled "heretical."

Yet we continue to make a public confession: God loves and welcomes LGBTQ+ people. We follow Jesus Christ without dividing people into "us" and "them." We receive the blessing and consolation of the Holy Spirit. We affirm the priesthood of all believers.

In the church's decision-making, we encourage members to ask honest questions and to reflect on their faith with integrity. After seeking shared understanding and consensus, we move forward together. We are committed to remaining thoughtful and disciplined, and to resisting extremism within the life of the church.

Worship

Sunday Worship: 11:00 a.m.–12:30 p.m.

You are welcome to arrive from 10:45 a.m. to quiet your heart and enter into silent prayer.

In each Sunday service, our song leaders and worship team guide the congregation to draw near to God. We open our hearts to connect with and encounter God, and to offer our lives as a living sacrifice in worship.

On the first Sunday of every month, we celebrate Open Communion. There is no requirement of religious background or denominational affiliation. Anyone may come to the table and receive the love of Jesus Christ.

Live interpretation is provided in Mandarin, English, and sign language.
